Environment


Protect the environment through water quality monitoring and reporting, as well as recreational enforcement.



■ 2019/20 ■ 2020/21 ■ 2021/22







Diel you know that the health of our estuary, and all living creatures that inhabit its surroundings, are negatively implicited by the loss of natural vegetation? This is because the founa and floor are closely interconnected, and rely on each other for successful reproduction.

The high bookkersity of animals at the Breede can be attributed to the many different habitat types that occur within the region. Renosterweld is no exception. A large number of animals depend on this habitat type that occurs no where else in the world. Sady, Renosterweld is Critically Endangered, with just 5% remaining overall.

Unlexful clearing of natural vegetation is a major problem along the Breede River. Despite officits to protect wait areas of Renosterwild by the Crientery Benosterweld Conservation Trust, damage and removal still takes place on a regular basis. 




An ecological asset under threat!

What is a Salt Marsh?

A salt marsh is a type of coastal wetland that is regularly flooded and drained by salt water brought in by the tices.

Salt marsh vegetation is sensitive to trampling and takes a very long time to grow.



What is happening at Grunter Bay?

Increased recreational fishing activity has resulted in:

Extensive erosion of the mud banks
 Destruction of sensitive vegetation
 Degradation of surrounding wetland
 Please DO NOT walk on any vegetation
 or bank edges. Failure to protect this
 sensitive ecosystem will result in complete closure thereof.

Why are they important?

Salt marshes provide our environment with many valuable ecosystem services.

They offer habitats for crustaceans, regulate erosion, fooding and stormwater surges, and improve the water quality by filtering pollutants, excess nutrients, and disease causing microorganisms.
